This call is for articles and creative works related to people marginalized by their race or ethnicity, including Black, Indigenous, and people of color (BIPOC) who do not identify as white.

We are especially interested in research, evidence-based editorials, photo-essays, creative works (short stories, poetry, short screenplays, visual art, etc.), and/or written reflections leveraging innovative theoretical perspectives and methodologies, as follows:

- Access to mental healthcare
- Generational trauma
- Increased stress from the weight of discrimination
- Microaggressions
- Sub-racial groups (e.g. Black African immigrants, Cambodian Americans, and Mexican Americans)
- Intersectional groups (e.g. Black women and queer and trans youth of color)
- **Policy, regulatory, and other solutions to these mental health crises**
